TAAP Your Way through Sports!

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Each month you'll find suggested core words to use while following the TAAP strategy!

You can TAAP your way through any activity or situation with your AAC learner. Using the TAAP strategy allows you to follow the lead of the AAC learner, make connections, and encourage communication. Plus, it allows you to communicate for more than just requesting and getting wants and needs met.

WHAT DOES TAAP STAND FOR?

Talk about it. Talk about what you see on the page or what you just read or played. Comment, state an opinion, share and show objects, or whatever else comes to your mind.

Ask a question. Ask your AAC learner an open-ended question to encourage their participation.

Acknowledge via response. Acknowledge and respond to your AAC learner. Let them know they have been heard and are part of the conversation. You may need to put what they say into context.

Propel the conversation and/or Predict. Keep the conversation going by making another natural comment, maintaining the topic, or make a prediction about what will happen next. Predicting is a great way to model your thoughts and ideas!

Look for this symbol each month for ideas and suggestions on words to model while you read and play! Previously, PRC-Saltillo's annual calendar has featured the TAAP method to explore science and art. This year, use the same TAAP strategy to learn, read, play, and talk about sports. As you read each book and play each game, implement the TAAP strategy. You'll find ideas for words to model while engaging in enjoyable activities. Use other words that make sense to you and your AAC learner in the moment. Keep the interaction natural and keep modeling!

Use a lite-tech system to keep everyone talking and playing in a safe way. Printing pages and vocabulary from your language system gives your learners the opportunity to communicate at all times.



A lite-tech system can be used at other times, too! If the AAC system breaks, the battery dies, or someone needs to model language, you can use a lite-tech system! There are many lite-tech boards and books available on our websites to support WordPower vocabularies.

On a Roll

Bowling is a fun sport that can be easily adapted anywhere! Keep the ball rolling this month with your own game of bowling.

What You'll Need

Buy a set of bowling pins from a toy store or make your own for this month's sport. To make your own bowling pins, you will need cardboard tubes (like toilet paper rolls) or plastic bottles. Feeling creative? Decorate your pins with paint, stickers, etc. Then grab any ball you have around to use as your bowling ball.





As you play, use the same words from the TAAP strategy above to TAAP your way through bowling. Here are some things you could say after each roll.

- T Uh-oh, I missed!, Uh-oh!, Great! I got a strike!
- A How will I get that pin?, Will I get it this time?
- A Maybe, maybe not., Maybe, I will!
- P Let's see if I can., Let's see!, Ok, we'll see!

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ASSEMBLE YOUR TEAM: EVERYONE PLAYS A ROLE!

Assembling a strong AAC team is crucial to helping people who use AAC develop successful communication.

Your team could include the family of the person using AAC, a speech-language pathologist, an occupational therapist, a physical therapist, a special education teacher, and any other relevant professionals. Each team member brings unique skills and perspectives to the table, creating a comprehensive approach to AAC implementation and support.

Try it out!

Communicate and collaborate regularly to ensure that all team members are on the same page and that your AAC learner is receiving consistent support across all settings (e.g. home, school, therapy, recreation).

Cross-Carpet Skiing

Have you ever been skiing indoors? No?! This is the perfect opportunity to stay in and ski around your house. Ski across your living room or create different trails throughout your house.

What You'll Need

+ If you have carpeting, create your skis from paper plates or Styrofoam[™] trays



+ If you have hard floors, use dish towels or washcloths

How to Play

- + Place your feet on your homemade skis.
- + Then slide your feet forward one at a time like you are cross-country skiing.
- + Tip: do not pick up your feet!
- + Change it up by seeing how fast you can go across the room.
- + Create a trail and go around objects and obstacles in your house.
- + If you need to modify the task a bit, try using a belt or rope to tow your skier along the trail.



As you play, use the same words from the TAAP strategy above to TAAP your way through skiing. Here are some things you could say after each run.

- T Wow! Wow, that's fun!, Wow, that is hard!
- **A** Who is next?, Who is going to jump in?
- A Maybe, maybe not., Maybe, I will!
- P Let's see if I can., Let's see!, Ok, we'll see!

MARCH 2024

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ANYONE CAN MODEL AAC

Encourage all members of your AAC team to model on an AAC system. This includes siblings, friends, family members, and teachers.

Sometimes you learn best when you are shown what to do, and how to say something new. Using an "I do, you do" modeling approach can be helpful.

Try it out!

In this strategy, the communication partner first models the use of the AAC system and then allows the AAC learner to practice using it themselves. Model basic and more advanced communication to help build language. The more you and your team practice modeling for your AAC learner, the better everyone becomes at using AAC. Everyone wins with this proven, effective approach!

> Example interaction: Adult: "What do you think about golf?" Peer: "I like it!"

The Race Is On!

Who will win the race in this exciting activity? Racing marbles with pool noodles can be fun and thrilling for everyone!

What You'll Need

- + Pool noodles cut in half to make the racing tracks.
- + Everyone in the race gets half a pool noodle.

How to Play

- Racers line up and create their track.
 You decide how fast or slow you want your track to be by adjusting the angle of your pool noodle. Make sure your marble doesn't fall off the track if you have it too steep or bent.
- 2. Racers hold their marble at the top of the track and wait for the go signal.
- 3. Upon the signal, racers release their marble.



4. Whoever gets to the bottom first wins!



As you play, use the same words from the TAAP strategy above to TAAP your way through racing. Here are some things you could say after each run.

- T Oh cool!, Amazing!, That was amazing!
- A Who will win?, Will it go fast?, Will you do it?
- A She did it!, I did it!
- P Keep doing more!, I want to keep this one.

APRIL 2024

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SAY IT AGAIN!

Expand on what your AAC learner says when trying to build their language skills and increase vocabulary.

Score big with this research-based strategy that exposes your AAC learner to more and varied words. They will hear longer utterances and see their language in action.

Try it out!

When your AAC learner says something on their AAC system, respond to attach meaning to what they said. You could also repeat what the AAC learner says and expand on it. In other words, rephrase what they say and add to it to build language.



For example, if your AAC learner says "Want ball" on their device, you could repeat what they say and expand their utterance by saying, "I love to play with the ball too! I want to play ball." Increase their language by modeling directly on the AAC system, or simply expand their language verbally.

- + Use any tokens or pieces you would like to represent your team.
- + Decide how many innings you will play and keep score using the scorecard.
- + Play ball!

As you play, use the same words from the TAAP strategy above to TAAP your way through baseball. Here are some things you could say after each play.

- T No way!, No way! Home run!, Oh my You're out!
- A What will I get?, What is the score?, What's next?
- A That's great!, Oh that would be silly!
- **P** I think I'm winning, I think you got it, I think...

MAY 2024

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POINT IT OUT

Verbal referencing is a strategy in which communication partners describe in words what an AAC learner is doing or trying to communicate, and model that language on their AAC system.

This helps the learner understand the connection between their actions and the language they can use to express themselves.

Try it out!

Tips for effective verbal referencing:

- + use clear and simple language
- + include visual cues or gestures
- + provide opportunities for practice and repetition



"It looks like you are going to throw the ball to me. THROW BALL. CATCH BALL."

By modeling what you think your AAC learner is trying to communicate based on their actions, you are helping them build language while encouraging them to talk about what they are doing.

JUNE 2024

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BUILD A TEAM

Peer interaction helps individuals who use AAC develop their communication skills.

Everyone wants to be part of a team, and friends make life more enjoyable. Research has proven that children learn a lot of language by interacting with children their same age. This is true for AAC learners as well! Creating and encouraging these interactions between your AAC learner and their peers can be beneficial for everyone. Peers offer opportunities and motivation to practice and use language in everyday situations.

Try it out!

Communication partners can encourage peer interaction by organizing social activities, such as playdates or group outings. This allows individuals using AAC to build relationships, share experiences, and practice their communication skills in a supportive setting. You'll be winning with AAC and so much more!

What You'll Need

Set up two goals at each long end of a table. Make the goals just by using tape to create a square. Or you can get fancier by building a small goal frame with cardboard and other materials you happen

How to Play

- + Remember to have fun!



As you play, use the same words from the TAAP strategy above to TAAP your way through lacrosse. Here are some things you could say after each play.

- T Good job!, Yikes you missed!, Yikes!
- A Who goes next?, What was that?, Who?
- A We can learn to do it, I want to learn to be better at this.
- P I need to..., Do you need this?



JULY 2024

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SET THE BAR HIGH!

Set goals high for implementing an AAC device!

Make sure you work with your team to determine manageable and achievable goals to keep everyone motivated and successful including your AAC learner.

Try it out!

There are many different skill areas to consider and address with your goals. Focus on building language, vocabulary, grammar, social skills, independence with an AAC system, or many other things.

Several frameworks are available to help you think about the different focus areas, such as LOSS framework developed by Dr. Janice Light.

Remember: Collaborate as a team to set your goals high and achieve them!

Olympic Toss

Prepare for the 2024 Summer Olympics with this sports-themed game. There are many ways you can create this traditional game.

What You'll Need

- + Posts can be made from paper towel tubes or dowels
- + Rings (like pool rings) or paper plates (cut the middle out to make a ring)

How to Play

- If you're feeling fancy, decorate your posts to match the colors of the Olympic logo.
- + Secure the posts to the playing surface.
- Place the posts in a row, in a pattern, or however you want.
- Toss your rings, aiming for the posts and earn points for each ring that lands on a post. The most points win a gold medal!



As you play, use the same words from the TAAP strategy above to TAAP your way through ring toss. Here are some things you could say after each toss.

- **T** Don't miss it!, I can do that too!, Don't do it like that.
- A Why did that happen?, Why can't I get it?
- A Maybe like this..., Maybe, we can!, Maybe.
- P Try this next time., Next turn., Next.

AUGUST 2024

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ASSIGN TEAM TASKS

Just like each athlete has a specific position on the field, every person on the AAC implementation team has a role to play to make AAC use successful.

Some people may do several jobs, while others may just have one. Remember: everyone's participation is important!

Try it out!

COACHING

TIP

Some team members may be assigned to give input on vocabulary and which words to add to the device. Another team member might oversee taking the device out every day. Other team members might be tasked with programming the device and making changes. Everyone is responsible for modeling language on the device.



Make sure everyone on your AAC team knows their roles and responsibilities. Work together to help your learner win with AAC!

KEEP TALKING TEAM!

Ask any athlete around, they will tell you communication is key!

To be a good player and an even better teammate, you must communicate on and off the field. What does this mean for the AAC team? It means everyone has a say in decisions and the team must talk to each other. Parents can't know what happened during the school day, so the teacher has to communicate to the parents. The private speech-language pathologist has to share with the teacher why words are or are not added to the AAC system. There are numerous scenarios and reasons to communicate.

Try it out!

Make it the team's goal and mission to communicate well from the beginning. Schedule times to meet to discuss how things are going, share progress, exchange stories, and work together. It all starts with consistent communication.

WAIT! I WASN'T DONE TALKING!

Being interrupted doesn't always feel very good.

Unfortunately for AAC learners, being interrupted is more common than you would think. Consider how much time you give AAC learners to respond to your questions or comments. Though everyone is different, best practice is to pause AT LEAST 10 seconds to allow an AAC learner to reply to a question or comment that was posed to them.

Try it out!

When you ask your AAC learner a question, count to 10 (or longer) in your head to give them time to reply. Ample wait time encourages them to formulate a response and answer your question. Wait time also lets your AAC learner know you care about what they have to say and are ready to wait to hear their answer.
