#### Tips to Engage, Expand, and Succeed:

- While making the sponge balls, let your child/client pick which color sponges they want for each sponge ball. Core words to use could be: want, like, red, green (etc. – any color), help, I, you
- A great way to work on some different reasons to communicate is to sabotage the child/client while making the balloons. For example:
  - If the child asks for green, give them blue. Wait for them to say: no, that's wrong, etc.
  - If you are at the step of tying the sponges together, let the child try. If they have difficulty, show them how to ask for help. Do not anticipate their needs! Instead, wait for them to ask for help.
- Don't force communication when playing. The child/client does not have to say go every
  time a water balloon in thrown. Instead, talk about it after: that was fun, you threw them
  all, you got me, etc.

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
