Tips to Engage, Expand, and Succeed:

- There is so much language you can teach while playing this game! Many colors, numbers, shapes, and basic concepts are core vocabulary words. Here are some examples:
 - Colors: What color do you want?, What colors did you get? (when the pins are knocked down), What color is it?
 - Numbers: Work on counting the pins that were knocked down. How many did you get?
 - **Shapes**: You can arrange the pins in different shapes. How many pins did they knock down? Which shape was easiest to knock down all the pins?
 - Basic Concepts: Up, down, all, none, some, there are all examples of concepts to focus on while playing.
- This is a perfect activity to have fun and focus on commenting. You did it! That was fun! Good job! Let's do more! You got all the pins! You got them all!


