Let's teach love na explained	<b>LOVE</b> you." Those are perhaps three of the best words to hear om your child, your spouse, or a dear friend. Due to its emotional lue, the word <b>LOVE</b> is the topic of many songs, books, and nversations. It conveys a feeling of value and appreciation and akes people feel good. In addition to people, we use the word to press our feelings toward food, toys, activities, actions, and aces. "I <b>LOVE</b> ice cream with sprinkles. Swimming is my favorite, I at <b>LOVE</b> it!." What do you <b>LOVE?</b> "
FIND	Find the word in the vocabulary. <b>LOVE</b> is a verb, so it will typically be a green word. It is often located on the "Actions" page of many vocabularies. If you can't find <b>LOVE</b> , use the Word Finder feature to learn where it is. If it is not in the vocabulary, you may want to add it.
	Use <b>LOVE</b> in context and try to explain it at the learner's level. Modeling, touching the word in the vocabulary as you say it, may help. Here's an example: " <b>LOVE</b> means to like someone or something a lot. For example, you <b>LOVE</b> Mom, Dad"
MODEL	Model the word throughout the day, touching <b>LOVE</b> in the vocabulary anytime you say it. "Don't you just <b>LOVE</b> that." "I <b>LOVE</b> it when you listen." "You really <b>LOVE</b> skittles." "Do you <b>LOVE</b> it or hate it?" "I <b>LOVE</b> that! Great job."
ENCOURAGE	Create activities to provide lots of models and practice with <b>LOVE</b> . Song: <i>Skidamarink: I LOVE you</i> Activity: Graph things you <b>LOVE</b> vs. things you don't <b>LOVE</b> Book: <i>Guess How Much I LOVE You</i>
ехрест	Create opportunities for the learner to say <b>LOVE</b> . Make sure to wait, and look so they know it is expected. Use the "Save Message" feature on the "Story Template" page to help the learner write about things he/she <b>LOVES</b> . Ask the learner's opinion about various activities, items. "Do you not like, like, or <b>LOVE</b> it?"
