SCRIPT: PICNIC

*Going on a picnic is a common activity that involves a lot of language. This script, used with the modified book about a picnic, will help to serve as a communication template for workshop practice. **Bolded** words are glossed (aided with symbols) in the book.*

The weather is beautiful! Let's **go** on a picnic. We can invite our friends to **go** with us.

We should go at lunchtime because the weather is the nicest. We can eat lunch in the park.

Let's invite Drew, Maya, and Matthew. They can **meet** us at the park by **the** benches.

But first we **need** to go to the store and get the food we want. **What** should we buy?

I love fruit! Should we get some fruit for our picnic?

Maybe some veggies and some dip, **please**? We can look to see what they have at the store.

What else sounds **good**?

What **about** some hot dogs? Do you think those would be good or bad for a picnic?

Or maybe a hamburger would be better? I'm not sure. What do you **want**? We could eat both!

I know! Ice cream too! I love ice cream.

We can also look around the park and see the flowers.

It will be a lovely **day** this time of year. We can have a great picnic with our friends in the park.
