



## **AAC & APHASIA - STRATEGIES**

## **Augmented Input**

- A set of strategies in which the communication partner supplements spoken language with gesturing, writing key words, or drawing.
- This helps support the PWA's comprehension and decrease frustration and communication breakdowns.

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
