AAC	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Augmentative and alternative communication</li> <li>• Methods of communication that we use to supplement or replace spoken or written language</li> <li>• Can vary with language systems that include words, phrases, sentences, keyboards, or a combination of all of these</li> <li>• Can range from writing, drawing, symbols, all the way up to a speech generating device with voice output</li> </ul>
language	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Represents words, either spoken or written</li> <li>• Using single words or combining them in a structured, rule-governed way</li> <li>• These rules are primarily learned through exposure and practice over time</li> <li>• Used to help us communicate more effectively</li> </ul>
communication	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• About the social interaction and the message it represents</li> <li>• Is sending and receiving information</li> <li>• It expresses thoughts and ideas</li> <li>• It helps us learn new things</li> <li>• Is helps us build relationships</li> </ul>

Myths:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• AAC will reduce the motivation to improve natural speech.</li> <li>• Children are not ready for AAC until they are in school.</li> <li>• There are pre-requisite skills needed before starting AAC.</li> </ul>
