



Core Vocabulary	
What is Core Vocabulary?	 250-400 words make up 75-85% of what we say Words that are the same across: gender, age, topic, setting, and disability Reusable across contexts, environments, and functions What classes make up core vocabulary? prepositions verbs adverbs pronouns interjections adjectives questions
What is Fringe Vocabulary?	 More specific than core vocabulary May be different for different people Mostly nouns 20% of the words we use
Why do we communicate?	 Commenting Protesting Requesting objects Requesting actions Responding to questions Greeting Naming things Relaying information Asking questions Gaining information
