aided language stimulation modeling augmented language partner augmented input **Aided language input** is a research-based strategy in which, communication partners highlight symbols on the AAC system as they interact verbally with the person using AAC with a goal to teach language. (Goosens, Crain, Elder, 1992, 1994)




When to Do It?
